Qualifications and Process for CEA/PA Scholarships for Non-Traditional Students

- Recipient must be a currently enrolled undergraduate student at a member CEA/PA college/university.
- Recipient must have completed 24 semester hours or equivalent of credit in residence at said institution.
- Recipient must possess a minimum quality point average of 3.5 on a 4.0 scale.
- Recipient must be a non-traditional student as defined by the home institution.
- Financial need will be used as a criterion. Need is what remains after other grants and scholarships have been applied. (Student should have filed a FAFSA form for 2009-2010 academic year.)
- Essay of 500-1000 words addressing the topic of the obstacles you have encountered to get to this point in your education.
- One letter of reference related to the essay topic. This reference may come from a variety of sources, e.g., teachers, advisors, your children, work associates/supervisors, clergy, etc.
- Complete the CEA/PA Scholarship Application and submit it along with your essay and **your official college transcript(s)** to :
